ACTONIANS LFC WAS FOUNDED IN 1998 as Chiswick United, before becoming Acton Sports Club four seasons later and then in 2008 part of Old Actonians, a men's club formed in 1925. They now have multiple women's and girls' teams. The women's first team are in the fourth tier FA Women's National League Division One South East and play at Middlesex FA headquarters at Rectory Park in Northolt.

PREVIOUS MEETINGS

Last season's home game at the Old Spotted Dog Ground last November ended up in a miserable 5-1 defeat, Actonians seemingly scoring with every attack, but by February's away

game we bounced back with a 2-0 win. The teams had met once before, in the semi-final of the John Greenacre Memorial Trophy, when CCFC won 3-0 at the Stray Dog.

FORM GUIDE

Actonians Reserves were promoted two seasons ago as champions - in fact that was their third promotion in succession. Last season they finished in sixth place, but won 1 and drew 1 against champions Sport London e Benfica.

MEET THE NEW WOMEN'S FIRST TEAM SIGNINGS

HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT NEW SIGNINGS WHO HAVE JOINED THE WOMEN'S FIRST TEAM SQUAD AHEAD OF THE NEW SEASON.

REBEKAH HIGGINS

Midfielder who joins us from Headstone Manor, where she was a near ever present over the last two seasons. Previously she played 12 times for Middlesbrough in the third tier of the women's football pyramid.

CLAIRE HUGGINS

Forward who scored 8 goals in 12 games for Romford last season, having previously played for higher level Enfield Town for several seasons.

JULIA MOULTON

The defender made eight appearances in the top flight of Scottish football for Edinburgh-based Spartans and previously played for Cyncoed, Millwall Lionesses and Southampton LFC.

CHLOE OWEN

Can play either as defensive midfielder or as a defender. She was at Leyton Orient

last season having previously played for Lincoln City Reserves and Lincoln United Development.

AIMEE SHAW

Striker who was top scorer for Headstone Manor last season with other previous clubs University of Birmingham, Camden Town and Arsenal Youth Development.

KAYLEE SHURETY

Defender who spent four seasons with Leyton Orient/London Seaward, during which time Kaylee captained their reserves side and played for



the first team at tier 4. Last season was spent at Chelmsford City, who won their division at tier 7, with a spell at Dartford (tier 5) too.

EVA VAN DER VLIET

Defender Eva van der Vliet joins us having spent last season at Watford Development, who play at the same level as us. Eva previously played for SOAS University of London and Graaf Willem in the Netherlands and has also played futsal for Bloomsbury in the top division of the game.

NEW RESERVES TEAM

Clapton CFC Women's Reserves Team will play in the Greater London Women's Football League Division 2 North in their first season in the football pyramid.

Home games are at Hackney Marshes on Sunday mornings at 10.30am - the same time and venue as our Men's Development Team play in the Hackney & Leyton League Premier Division. Head coach Amii Griffith and assistant Johanna Kuosa will lead the team, which is a successor to the Development Team. The league season begins on September 8 at home against Tower Hamlets Reserves.
