



# SCEFL STATE OF PLAY

## FLUSHED WITH SUCCESS

A quick update on the plans for a new toilet block at the Old Spotted Dog Ground. As you may have read, after a six-month planning process, permission was granted by Newham Council in November.

The joint application

to the Premier League Stadium Fund from the club and the Old Spotted **Ground Trust has** now been approved, which means they will contribute up to 70 per cent of the cost. Work will start as soon as possible.

The toilets will be located on the right hand side of the main stand and will include accessible toilets, baby changing facilities, three cubicles and urinals. They are in addition to the toilets in the Clubhouse.

They will replace the sinking wooden trailer-type toilet block which had to be demolished due to the poor condition early last year.

## **NEW PUB PLANS UNVEILED**

New plans for the Spotted Dog pub next door to the OSD ground were submitted to Newham Council last month.

pub, and building 36 flats on the remainder of the site.

In a previous proposal, those flats were going to be a 68-room hotel instead but those plans stalled after the Covid pandemic.
