THREE WINS WAS THE TARGET FOR the first three home games of the year and we started well with the victory against Sporting Club Thamesmead. Unfortunately the weather then intervened and the FC Elmstead game was postponed.

We didn't really know what sort of team to expect from Thamesmead with their recent managerial change but we just had to do a professional job and get through to the next round of the league cup.

Our major issue this season has been converting the chances we have been creating and punishing teams at critical moments of the game. Finally it all came together and really 5 or 6 on the night wouldn't have flattered us in the slightest.

Fitness and injuries are improving so it's important we manage the squad effectively as the pitches

get heavier and the weather gets worse. So it's a good headache to have at this stage of the season.

Now if I'm being totally honest, our league position probably reflects our inconsistent season so far and we will just miss out on the play-offs if we continue on this trajectory. I believe the play-off picture will become clearer after the next 5 games so we have to stay within touching distance by claiming maximum points today.

We had a friendly last week vs Enfield Borough solely to increase our match fitness and sharpness before we face the in-form team in the league, Halls. It will be a totally different game from the previous encounter earlier in the season but the objective remains the same.
