THE 3-2 DEFEAT AT FAVERSHAM Strike Force last Saturday was a big setback in our play-off quest and particularly disappointing as we had felt in control of the game.

Naturally you would expect Faversham to take the initiative being at home and we needed to see out the first 20 minutes. However, we conceded a sloppy early goal from a set piece. We then showed great character after a tactical tweak to get back into the game and draw level, and going into half-time we seemed the team most likely to take the lead.

The game plan for the second half was to keep applying the pressure so we could get the second but we couldn't pick up the tempo or get our passing going. That ultimately

led to Faversham getting back into the game and they capitalised every time they had a spell on top.

Our away form will have to improve drastically as there is a good possibility if we do make the play-offs that we will be away for both ties, not to mention a potential away semi-final in the League Cup.

Four consecutive home games first, however, starting with Bridon Ropes and we have to target 9 points at least. Today is the most difficult of the four as Bridon compete very well and also have multiple systems they switch to within the game. We are well aware of the threat they pose with two defeats already this season. But it's do or die season now and that's often when we are at our best!

BRIDON ROPES FC

WELCOME TO TODAY'S VISITING PLAYERS, COACHES. SUPPORTERS AND OFFICIALS

BRIDON ROPES FC WAS FORMED AS A FACTORY team in 1935 by workers at the British Ropes Works in Charlton. It was originally called British Ropes FC, before becoming Bridon Sports in 1990 and Bridon Ropes in 1992. The name Bridon originates from 'British' and 'Doncaster', where the company is headquartered.

After spells in the London Spartan, Spartan South Midlands, London Intermediate and Kent County leagues, they've been in this division for over a decade. There's been some near misses from promotion since (including 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th places) while last season new manager Lee Roots led them to 10th place safety.

PREVIOUS MEETINGS

It's played two, lost two, against Bridon so far. In the SCEFL League Cup in September, we lost 3-1 here, albeit with a much-changed side. Then away in the league, we lost 3-2 having led 2-1 late on.

FORM GUIDE

Bridon are in superb form - unbeaten in 9 games and just 1 defeat in 15 games. That's lifted them above us into the play-off spots just at the right stage in the season.

PLAYERS TO WATCH

Striker Pat Ward has 12 goals this season putting him just below our own Fred Taylor. Meanwhile Ronan Dunphy has scored in both games against us so far, and has six for the season in total.
