In their two seasons at our level they've finished in tenth place twice. This season they were due to merge with the men's club, Hampton & Richmond. But due to a reported water bill, they had to pull out.

### PREVIOUS MEETINGS

It's been four wins and a draw in our meetings thus far. Earlier in the season, we won 5-1 away, while last season we won both meetings 7-1. The previous season's games were played on the

same day, back to back, shortened to 60 minutes. The first ended 0-0 then we won the second 2-1.

### FORM GUIDE

Richmond Park are in 11th place, the second relegation place, so need wins to move out of the drop zone. The last few weeks have been tough, with heavy defeats against high-flyers Brentford and Leatherhead, but they recently beat AFC Whyteleafe and went close against Actonians Reserves and Ashmount Leigh.
